ON THIS SITE FROM 1886 STOOD THE BELLE VUE HOTEL. REGARDED FOR MANY YEARS AS BRISBANE'S PREMIER HOTEL. THE CAST IRON BALUSTRADING THAT DECORATED ITS SPACIOUS VERANDAHS WAS MUCH ADMIRED.

THE HOTEL WAS BOUGHT BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT IN 1967 FOR USE BY MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY SERVING RURAL AND PROVINCIAL ELECTORATES.

THERE WAS WIDESPREAD OUTRAGE WHEN THE BUILDING WAS DEMOLISHED WITHOUT WARNING IN THE EARLY HOURS OF APRIL 21, 1979.
