<u>gnuZ</u>

A lot of effort has gone into news and current affairs in the past twelve months.

The aim has been to maintain or improve on existing current affairs programs which are mainly received by the unemployed while creating regular news bulletins that provide information during periods when the employed listen as well as following (and sometimes propelling) stories as they unfold.

News and current affairs are resource hungry in terms of reporter training and equipment (telephone recorder booths, portable recorders and editing facilities).

•Enter the University of Queensland Journalism Department who previously provided bulletins for 4RPH (Radio for the print handicapped). The Department paid to transfer their landline to 4ZZZ and they in turn gained a much larger audience. The project occurred at a time when the Department wanted to see their students persue issues from a community perspective. The students naturally come from a variety of backgroundsincluding those who have only known the mainstream news agenda. Special thanks must go to Bruce Grundy, Chris Lowe-Davies and A nna Day for having the vision to link public radio, community via lues and journalism together.

•The first year was a succesful year a learning exercise for both sides, while the Z Newsroom broadcast two bulletins of our own at 4 and 5pm.

The future is much more ambitious. Firstly the UQ department s plan is to move away from an AAP driven adgenda, now students will be marked only on original news stories.

•Equally important from the beginning of September UQJD will enter into a joint venture with Public Radio News in Melbourne to produce twelve bulletins a day that will be distributed via the community radio satellite (ComRadSat).

Last month Triple Zed became the sixty-ninth public station in the network to install a dish. This new service will be contributer-station-driven, ie it will not follow an AAP agenda, but will gather news from contributior stations from each centre where it is broadcast. In Brisbane this will be 4ZZZ & UQJP. In Sydney it will be 2SER, in Melbourne 3CR, in Bathurst it will be 2MCE and so on A potential weakeness will be insufficient resources to employ a Canberra staffer (the local public broadcaster 2XX may have fallen asleep were not sure).

We are not locked into any long term commitment. Because it is new there will be many mistakes and it is likely there will be unhappyness over various things. But we will give it a go, do our best to make it a success and watch with interest. Where will this leave the triple zed newsroom? Our international news gathering resources have strengthened enormously.

·We were the first media outlet to reveal the abduction of three aboriginal youths by police; the first in Australia to reveal the three Timorese students to be shot by the Indonesians.

We are breaking new stories every week. We have stringers in Britain Cambodia and the USA, and will recruit more as time goes on.

·Listeners will probably have noticed a leap in quality when the newsroom switched from cassette grabs to digitally edited grabs via computer.

•The news room is entering into a co-operative relationship with local access television BRIZ 31. A visually enhanced version

Other how things to appear soon will be a Bats Single, Head Like A Hole album and new stuff from Martin Phillips and a new Muttonbirds LP in Sept. On the deficit side the Straight jacket Fits are no more but apparently Shane is back home in Dunedin working on new material with a new band.







Bad Boy Bubby

Every once in a while a film comes along that has a little bit of everything. Bad Boy Bubby, written and directed by Rolf de Haas, is one of those films.

It's about a 35 year old man who has been locked in a room all his life. His abusive mother alternatively beats him and fucks him as the mood takes her.

The first half of the film which explores this relationship can only be dexcribed as harrrowing, but when Bubby ventures into the outside world for the first time, the mood of the film radically alters.

Seeing the world through Bubby's innocent, imitive eyes shows the world for the funny/tragic place it is. As the man/child wanders from one aspect of society to another Rolf de Haas explores the prejudices and stereotypes we live with, bu fail to recognise. The themes Bad Boy Bubby explores are almost endless - perceptions of kindness, judging stereotypes, religious fundamentalism, hypocracy - the list goes on. All of these themes are explored in the form of questions. No answers are given, and no preaching is practiced. Throughout, Nicolas Hope gives an amazing performance in the central role of Bubby. He has the right balance between child-like innocence and adult desire. Bad Boy Bubby is funny, thought provoking, deeply twisted and Australian. For all these reasons you should go out and see it.

Hudsucker Proxy

When your talking about the Coen brothers, you expect a film that is blackly funny, a little twisted, and very brilliant.

What you get with The Hudsucker Proxy is a very good film, that dosen't quite live up to expectations.

The film centres around a mailroom clerk promoted to head of the company in order to act as a puppet for the backroom boys while they deliberately run the company into the ground.

Tim Robbins plays the mail clerk, and looks akward throughout. It's obvious that he's acting, and that means he's not doing a very good job.

The other performances are more satisfying, with Jennifer Jason Leigh's characterisation of the jadded, tough as nails reporter being a great comic performance. Paul Newman as the dodgy company vice-president is obviously having a lot of fun with jis role, and plays the meglomanic role to the hilt.

MUSIC

FRANK BLACK - "TEENAGER OF THE YEAR" (4AD RECORDS)

Two things that have to be put inot the arena and thrown around before going any further ... (1) this is so far superior to his previous solo lp as to rrender the other non existent. (2) quite why the frankly uninspired and uninspiring Breeders are coasting along on the crest of the post Pixies "future of alternative rock" wave is beyond me. Black Francis was, for the uninitiated, the creator, fiend, unique vision and guiding force of the Pixies. Kin Deal was not. The Breeders are lazy, Frank Black is not. Neither, on the basis of the last 2 albums they have delivered deserve the press (good or bad) that they receive. Having offended virtually everybody..the review:

This is a double lp/single cd of huge proportions. It would make a wonderful lp as these things usually would. There are glimpses that frank has got back on track (the lyrics are so spacy a anything you could espect of the Pixies, the songs have that certain quality about them that betray in a moment just who wrote them. There are some awsomely wonderful things on this album. the biggest problem is that there are just too many things to choose from that after a while it all starts to sound the same.

Which is a same because this album deserves a listern by everyone who loves Boston music and anyone who owns the Breeders Ip. It's weird, it's wonderful, it has fabulous song titles all over it. the single is one of the least inspiring things on it too. Start with "I want to live on an abstract plain" and go from there.;

VELOCITY GIRL - "SIMPATICO"

Well it's been a long time now since anyone could accuse Sub Pop of being grundy and predictable. Unfortunately the same cannot be said of a lot of their bands. Velocity Girl has awesome singles-songs to carry around in your head til they drive you beserk with their wonderful melodies. Their albums however, won't. Some will dfind the female vocals clinging and annoying, some will find the utter lack of constistency on their albums frustrating. If like me, you think the singles are godhead, then the lps will unfortunately disappoint. Their last lp "Copacetic" announced to the world that VG could write great singles, and boring album filler. This lp hasn't changed that one iota. Some songs you'll adore as always for the innocent pop sensibilities that are imbued in every ringing chord, some songs you'll snooze to. You could do worse. My advice, stop the boy from singing and eradicate all the slow dirty ones... Good in parts. H Chalmers

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
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
