"Paris is Ours" is a giant film in size and concept: it took two years to make and is virtually an epic in its treatment of subject.It lasts for 2 hours 20 minutes !

Involved in the film are two of the best known and respected French directors, Goddard and Truffant who both appear in acting roles. Combined with the talent of Rivette the collection has lent an air of genius to the film.

In view of the recent French Revolution, the film is almost prophetic and is certainly important as a film milestone. A plot of sorts is contained in the story of Anne, a student in Paris who becomes convinced that a member of her elder brother's circle of friends has been killed and that a friend of hers is in a similarly dangerous position.

Rivettes basic intention was to show Paris as a melting pot where individuals lose their identity; but the story deals with the idea in forthright, if not paranoic terms, the idea that there is a world wide organisation heading towards anarchy.

Because of the length of this film it will only be screened once, starting at 7.30.At 10.00 their will be a programme of short films

O MR. BROMLEY : (NORMAN)

Before I support the amendment moved by my Leader I want to refer briefly to an article that appeared in today's "Telegraph" under the heading, "Club 'Drugs Base' Claim". This article is allegedly supplied by Mr.Don Cameron, the young Liberal member for Griffith in the Federal Parliament. Iwant to say, without any fear or doubt at all, to the House and to Mr. Cameron and his stooges, that the place he refers to as the "FOCO CLUB" is not what he claims. I want to say that Mr.Cameron is a liar and a coward for saying this sort of thing in the Federal House. It is known out in his electorate of course, that young people are frightened to be alone with this man. As far as I can see - and it is well known - there is one thing he likes better than going on a"trip".
